Recipe:

375g (12oz) Sunbeam Mixed Fruit

3/4-cup brown sugar	2 eggs lightly beaten
1 teaspoon mixed spice	2 tablespoons marmalade
1/2-cup water	1 cup SR flour
125g (4oz) butter	1 cup plain flour
1/2-teaspoon bi-carb soda	1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2-cup sherry	

Method: Place the Sunbeam Mixed Fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm (8") round cake tin. Bake in a moderately slow oven for approximately 1 hour or until cooked when tested.

RECIPE

3 tablespoons margarine 2 tablespoons cocoa
 1 cup S.R. Flour 1 cup of sugar
 ½ cup (120ml) milk 2 eggs
 ½ teaspoon almond essence

Method: Melt margarine, put all other ingredients in bowl, pour in melted margarine and mix well for 2 - 3 minutes. Grease & flour tin sides of a ring tin, line bottom of tin with glad bake. Pour mixture in to tin, cook at 140 degrees for 30 - 35 minutes or until cooked when tested with a skewer.

Recipe

200 gm butter ½ cup cocoa
 2 cups of brown sugar 1 tspn imitation vanilla essence
 1 cup plain flour 2 eggs
 ½ cup chopped walnuts

Method: Preheat oven to 180 degrees. Grease a 30 x 20cm tin. Melt butter and cocoa over low heat in large pan (do not boil). Add sugar and vanilla, stir in completely. Take off heat, sift in the flour and stir in. Add eggs, beat them in well. Add chopped walnuts, stir in. Pour mixture in to tin, spread over evenly. Bake for 20 - 25 minutes. When cool, ice with chocolate icing.

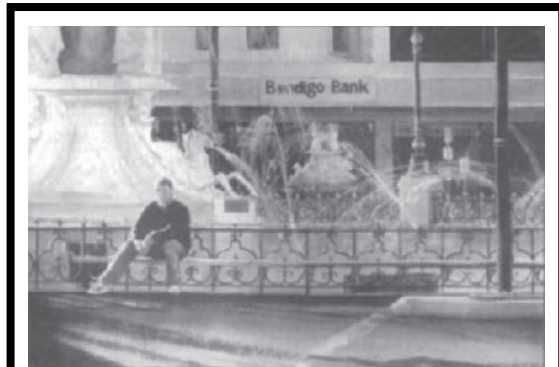
